#### **Detail**

9<sup>th</sup> grade - Students will tour Indiana University East in Richmond, IN. Students will take buses from THS and supervised by Talawanda staff. Students will be provided lunch at no cost. Please dress appropriately for an outside walking tour.

10<sup>th</sup> grade - ASVAB is a vocational aptitude inventory that has traditionally been associated with the military, however it is used by a number of industries to identify aptitude and interest. Because our sophomores are taking it, the scores are never actually reported to the military. Test should end by noon and Sophomores are free to leave after.

11<sup>th</sup> grade\* - This is the second year of the state-funded, required ACT. This is a great opportunity for all students to take a free administration of the ACT. The ACT not only determines eligibility for admittance to colleges and universities, but can also positively impact scholarship opportunities and placement in vo-tech and career institutions. ACT should end by noon, and Juniors are free to leave after.

12<sup>th</sup> grade - We have long wanted to incorporate a community service/job shadow component to our requirements for Senior Incentive. This unique day at THS provided a great opportunity to do this. We hope this will positively impact our community as well as our graduating Seniors.

#### Dear Talawanda Families:

The Talawanda community has been so sad to learn of one more school tragedy that occurred this past week in our country. We grieve for those students, families, educators! Our heartfelt thoughts and prayers go out to the entire Parkland, Florida community. It is terrible that schools *must* prepare their safety plans and procedures in ways that address potential threats of violence against children in our schools.

As a member of the education/school community, and as a guardian of the students who pass through our doors, I feel it is imperative that student welfare and safety be our first priority within the Talawanda School District.

The district administrators meet with local safety officials each quarter to evaluate the district's emergency plans, resources, and training needs. Administrators are asked to review building safety plans on a regular basis. Staff members are asked to keep their emergency protocols on their desks so that they are easily accessible. Annually, safety officials from the Oxford Police Department and the Butler County Sheriff's Department volunteer their time to provide ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training to our K-12 students. The state requires that drills are conducted annually, functional table top drills are conducted every other year, while functional drills are conducted every third year. We have been engaged in planning a functional community drill for many months that will take place on August 31, 2018. Community volunteers will be asked to assist with this task


